1.5 RADIO LICENCES

NMT and GSM mobile stations, LA (CB), PR 27 and PMR 446 telephones are exempted from licensing, provided they fulfill the requirements of relevant equipment standards and specifications. The use of all other kinds of radio transmitters is subject to licence issued by the Finnish Communications Regulatory Authority (FICORA).

FICORA shall be notified of the frequencies in the equipment in question, upon which it will decide on assigning the customer a suitable frequency and will issue a licence for the radio transmitter. Throughout the rally, the use of frequencies for amateur radio is prohibited. Further information is available from FICORA/Radiohallinto/PMR-luvat, P.O. 1.6 TOBACCO AND ALCOHOL ADVERTISING

Advertising of tobacco, tobacco products and imitations, as well as smokers' requisites is forbidden according to the Finnish legislation on cars, competition/service equipment and on the team members' outfits. The advertising of alcoholic beverages is limited according to the Finnish legislation to mild alcoholic beverages under 22% alcohol in volume. Such brand logos may appear on the competition and service vehicles, as well as on drivers' overalls during the event, but the appearance of drivers in advertisements of such beverages can be interpreted as connecting alcohol with driving and is therefore not allowed. 1.8 SHAKEDOWN STAGE

Shakedown stage will be arranged on Wednesday 4.8.2010 at 18:00 – 21:00. Stage is about 3 km and it's located in Kylmäsuontie 385, Myrskylä, about 40 km from Lahti. Stage will be run in accordance the Finnish National Sporting Regulations (and its appendix). The organizer provides possibility for route reconnaissance. Entry Fee 50 € in cash.

2. RUNNING OF THE RALLY

2.1 ENTRY FEES AND PACKAGES

The packages include the following:

- Service plates 1
- Road books 1
- Route maps 2
- Gala Dinner tickets 2

The materials can be picked up from the Rally Info at the Rally HQ during the Administrative checks.

The descriptive route notes for special stages cost 40 €.

Lunch is served for EM Historic drivers on Friday 6.8. between 11:30 – 16:00 in Jokivarsi school, address Käkeläntie 24, 16300 Orimattila. EM Historic competitors will be given lunch tickets with the material, but for others lunch costs 10 €.

2.2 CUSTOMS CLEARANCE FOR CARS AND EQUIPMENT

Competitors from the European Union

Competitors coming from the European Union do not need to make any special customs clearance. They may use their rally car in Finland for 30 days without clearing it, for the service vans the time is 6 months. Tyres and reserve parts can also be imported without clearance. It is always good to have a list of tools and equipment you bring into the country, in case you will be asked to prove what you had with you on the way in.

Competitors from outside the European Union Competitors coming from outside the European Union will have to report at the customs on their way in. Please prepare a list of all the tools and equipment you are bringing with you. This list will be stamped at the customs and they may collect a guarantee fee (the amount is negotiable). Tyres are under customs as they are non-durable goods. The customs payment will be returned if the used tyres are exported from the country on the way out, as well as the guarantee fee, if all equipment is exported. All competitors coming from outside EU countries have to report at the customs!

2.3 DOCUMENTATION

Administrative checks will take place at the Rally HQ on Wednesday 4.8. at 08:00-15:00 and Thursday 5.8. 08:00-10:00.

At the documentation the following documents will be checked:

- drivers' competition and driving licences
- competitor/entrant licence
- drivers' medical certificates of aptitude
- authorisation for the drivers' by their ASN to take part in the rally
- rally car's insurance cover towards third parties (Green Card or equivalent proof)
- rally car's registration papers
- correctness of all information given on the entry form

Those living within the EU should bring the E111 form with them, to make sure they will get free medical care in the health care centres and hospitals.

2.4. RECONNAISSANCE INFO

8.5

8.5.1 - Route reconnaissance

Duration and conditions:

- route reconnaissance may be performed by the entered crews after receipt of the road book; reconnaissance must always be made in accordance with the Highway Code.

- the period of reconnaissance is fixed as follows:
Wednesday 4.8. 08:30 – 17:00 hours
Thursday 5.8. 08:30 – 15:00 hours,
Super SS1/9 12:00 – 15:00
- competitors are allowed to traverse each special stage only twice, including those that are driven twice. Super SS1/9 is allowed to traverse only by foot or bicycle.

Crews are not permitted to drive in opposite direction.

The organizer monitors speed and general behavior of the competitors on the reconnaissance route, by using any kind of means.

2.5 SCRUTINEERING

Technical scrutineering will take place at Automaa Oy, Saksalankatu 28, Lahti, on Thursday 5.8.2010 at 09:00 -16:00.

The drivers' equipment (helmets and flame resistant clothing) will be checked at the scrutineering. On the special stages drivers must use these overalls, long underwear, balaclava, gloves (drivers only), socks and shoes according to App. L, chapter III, art. 2. Concerning the helmets, please consult the FIA regulations, App. L, chapter III, art. 1.

Insurances

During the rally all rally cars must have a valid obligatory traffic insurance. This includes coverage for bodily injuries with no limit of indemnification. In Finland the Green Card system is applied and all competitors **MUST** be able to show their Green Cards at documentation. For cars coming from countries outside the Green Card system and EEA countries, Nordic frontier insurance must be taken at the Finnish, Swedish or Norwegian border. This also guarantees civil responsibility towards third parties. If a competitor does not take this insurance, the Organiser will apply this insurance for a competitor and will collect the insurance payment from competitor. The insurance costs 40€. The insurance sticker must be affixed on rally car before scrutineering. When you go to the technical scrutineering, please make sure that the number plates are affixed on your car.

NOTE! All windscreen advertisements are banned during the rally, and must be removed when entering scrutineering.

2.6 SERVICING ARRANGEMENTS

Service

Servicing is only allowed in the road sections and/or service parks. These areas are marked in the road book of the rally. Please note that servicing in private yards and bus stops is forbidden.

There is a 30 kph speed limit in the service park. All infringements will be reported to the Stewards, who may impose sanctions to their discretion.

8.4 - Traffic - Repairs

8.4.1 -Throughout the rally, competitors must strictly observe the traffic laws. The penalties for infringement of traffic laws will be as follows:

- 1st infringement: cash penalty of 150 euros,
- 2nd infringement: 5 min. time penalty,
- 3rd infringement: exclusion from the rally.

8.4.3 -Service cars are forbidden to park or to assist within 300 m of a control point. Any crew who is serviced in any forbidden zone defined in the road book will be subject to a penalty up to exclusion. For an offence of parking within a forbidden zone, a cash penalty of 200 euros will apply.

2.7 START OF THE RALLY

There will be no Parc Fermé at the start of the rally, but Competitors must enter the start area one (1) hour before their given start time. NOTE! Starting order for the Ceremonial Start and Super Special Stage 1, on Thursday 05.08.2010, will be reverse on numbering; 103, 102, 101, 100, 99, 98, 97... Starting order for leg on Friday will be based on numbering; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7... Timecards will be given at Start TC.

2.8 NOTES ON RUNNING OF THE RALLY & GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The CRO will operate at key points of the rally throughout the duration of the event, and he will help the competitors in all their problems and will be available at scrutineering, start, regroupings, parc fermé and finish.

2.9 STOPPING ON SS AND RETIREMENT

SOS and Green OK in the Road Book

There is an SOS sign at the back of the road books. The marshals have been instructed of its meaning. You must use the SOS to get medical assistance for injured persons. Show it to the marshals or to fellow competitors, so that they will know to call for help. If you see this sign given by another competitor, please give the message to the closest possible place (on Special Stages marked radio points or start/finish). If you do not require medical help please show the green OK sign to the marshals and to your fellow competitors.

Retirement

If the crew has to retire from the competition, they must immediately notify the control centre. The telephone number can be found in the road book. Also the withdrawal form can be found in the road book, please fill this in and return it together with your time card to the nearest time control or to the sweeper car.

Please remember to collect your FIA passport from Rally Office after rally or after retirement.

2.10 FINISH, PRIZE-GIVING AND PARC FERMÉ

The finish podium will be located at the Vesijärven satama (Harbour of Vesijärvi, Lahti). All cars will be driven to a holding area. In this area, it is forbidden to make any service. From the holding area, marshals will guide the competitors to the finish podium.

First of the crews positioned 3th to 1st overall drive to finish podium, open doors, climb out, get flowers and champagne and will be interviewed.

After interviews crews drive a car to the front of podium and come out to wait until first three crews are placed. After that, the rest of crews will drive thru near by the podium in the order as they have arrived to the finish. If competitor will get prize it will be given at the Gala dinner.

The finish time control of the rally will be in the area near by Rally HQ. There competitors will get special time card from that area to the finish and parc fermé. All competitors have to drive to parc fermé after the finish. The parc fermé will be opened when final classifications have been published.

Showers and dressing rooms

There are showers and dressing rooms at Rally HQ. Please follow the signs.

3. GENERAL INFORMATION

3.1 MEDICAL INFORMATION

At the administrative checks before the rally all drivers must present their Medical Certificate of Aptitude in accordance to the FIA medical standards, and as given to them by their own ASN. A decision in accordance with Finnish law has been taken by the Health Care District Central Finland that an individual living elsewhere than in Finland must pay the total cost of treatment received unless other provision has been made in international agreements. Residents of EU/EEA/Nordic countries, Australia, Canada, Chile, Estonia, Hungary, Israel, Latvia, Switzerland and the USA Finland has made agreements concerning patient charges for individuals living abroad with the above mentioned countries. If you are a resident of one of the above countries, you must demonstrate by means of documentation (e.g. form E111, passport to prove your nationality) that you are covered by the social insurance system of your home country. In such cases the patient charge is the same as for those living in Finland. Otherwise the charge will be the total cost of treatment plus the patient charge for an individual living in Finland.

Residents of other countries

If you are a resident of a country other than those mentioned above, the patient charge will be the equivalent of the total cost of treatment plus the patient charge for an individual living in Finland.

Payment of the patient charge

If you require first aid, collection of the patient charge will be made as you leave hospital. Collection of the charge will take place in advance in cases where you have agreed with the hospital on treatment that is not urgent. Should an insurance institution be responsible for your patient charges, acceptable evidence of this must be presented to the hospital. All competitors living in the European Community should bring the E111-form with them from the social/health authorities of their country to be able to get free medical services at the communal health care centres and hospitals.

The organiser also has a liability insurance upto EUR 504.564.

3.2 FACTS ABOUT FINLAND

Population

5.2 million, giving an average density of only 15.4 per sq. kilometre; annual growth rate 0.16%. Life expectancy 77.58 years. The demographic pyramid resembles that of most other industrial countries, with the middle-aged groups predominating. Average household sizes 2.2 persons. 54% of the population live in single-family houses, 43% in apartment blocks; room area per person 34 sq. metres. 77% are urban-dwellers, with 0.9 million in Helsinki and the adjacent cities of Espoo and Vantaa. Other major cities include Tampere, Turku, Oulu and Lahti.

Area

337,030 sq. kilometres, of which 10% is water. There are more than 60,000 lakes in Finland. 6% of the land is under cultivation, barley and oats being the main crops. Forests (mainly pine and spruce) cover 68% of the country.

Climate

The Finnish climate is considerably milder than one might expect from the country's northerly location. There are major variations in the seasons. During the rally, it is spring and the weather may vary quite a lot. It can be sunny and warm, over 25 degrees Celsius or it can rain and be only about 10 degrees Celsius.

Time zone

Finnish time is two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +2 hours). Daylight saving time is used from the last Sunday of March to the last Sunday of September.

Language

Finnish 93.4% of the population

Swedish 5.9% of the population

English is spoken by almost everybody, German and French by some.

Sauna

In Finland, there are 5.2 million inhabitants and 1.5 million saunas. Finnish people take to sauna like the way a fish takes to water! Sauna is a time for relaxing with friends and family, a time for physical and spiritual refuelling of one's body and mind. You have to experience it to truly savour one superb Finnish tradition. An old Finnish proverb states to the effect that "if sauna, liquor or tar don't help...the disease must be fatal".

Currency and Banking

Finnish currency unit is euro (EUR), divided into 100 cents. The denominations in circulation are:

Notes - 500, 200, 100, 50, 20, 10 and 5 euros

Coins - 2 and 1 euros; 50, 20, 10 and 5 cents (2 and 1 cent coins not in active use).

Foreign currency may be exchanged in banks Monday to Friday at 09:30-16:30. Most banks display exchange rates on their windows.

Automatic Teller Machines

All these banks have several cash dispensers all over the city. They usually operate on Visa/Eurocard. You can recognise these from an orange sign "OTTO".

Credit Cards

All major credit cards are very widely accepted in hotels, car rental offices, department stores, restaurants, shops and most taxis. Foreign credit cards can be used to withdraw cash from almost all ATMs.

Medical Services

Medicines are sold at pharmacies (APTEEKKI). Usually pharmacies are open until 17:00 or 18:00. Some pharmacies are open until 23:00. All hospitals have doctors on duty around the clock. In emergencies, patients should be directed to a health care centre or hospital emergency unit. Dental care is mainly provided by private practitioners.

Vaccinations

There are no regulations requiring visitors to Finland to have vaccinations.

Water

Tap water is safe to drink.

Electricity

The electric current in Finland is 230 Volts. Plugs and sockets are the same as in the continental countries of the European Union.

Telephones

There are pre-paid SIM cards available for your GSM mobile phones at 'R-Kioski' in various values. Please ask for Sonera SIM cards. There are also public phones which work with phonecards, ask for cards at your hotel or R-kioski. International prefix is 990
Area code for Lahti is 03 (+358-3 from abroad)

3.3 DRIVING IN FINLAND

Most traffic signs in Finland are international. By observing traffic regulations and speed limits, you can avoid danger.

Obligatory Safety Devices

In Finland, it is obligatory for the drivers and all passengers in the car to use safety belts both in front and in back seats. In addition, the children must use safety belts or other safety equipment designed for children. Their parents or driver of the car are held responsible for this.

Speed Limits

On densely populated areas there is a speed limit of 50 kph or it has been specifically shown with traffic signs. Entrance signs show you where the speed limit starts and ends. Outside these areas, the general speed limit is 80 kph. Any speed limit other than that will be indicated by a traffic sign varying between 30 and 120 kph. In addition to this, there are speed limits for certain vehicle types. Car towing a trailer may not drive faster than 80 kph. The same rule applies for trucks, for most of the busses and for the bigger vans. If you exceed the speed limit, you will be fined. Exceeding the limit by more than 30 kph means immediate withdrawal of driving licence. **The organiser will oversee speed and driving method during reconnaissance.**

Lights On - Also In Daylight

Driving lights must always be lit. Fog lights may only be used during fog or heavy rain.

No Drunk Driving

In Finland it is forbidden to drive drunken. Police who is controlling the traffic can order you to be breathalysed. The limit for penalty is 0,5 per mill. Drunk driving will be penalised. In addition to this, your driving licence will be withdrawn immediately.

Obey Traffic Rules

Drive on the right, overtake from the left. Give way to any vehicle coming from the right - bicycles, too. Give way to a bus leaving from the bus stop on areas where the speed limit is under 60 kph. In towns, you may use the bus lane only in case you are turning. Give way to pedestrians. Do not overtake without stopping a vehicle which has stopped within 5 metres before a pedestrian crossing or which stops you from seeing the pedestrian crossing. Give way to bicyclists and motorcyclists who are crossing the road when you are turning in a crossing.

It is forbidden to overtake on a yellow line on the road. Please overtake only when you can return to your own lane without endangering and disturbing other traffic. If a vehicle in front of you is turning left or is clearly going to do that you will always have to drive past it from the right. In Finland, it is also forbidden to stop or park the car on sidewalks and in parks, as well as on pedestrian crossings, on bicycle roads or in front of them. General disregard in traffic can be penalized, up to the withdrawal of driving license. Police controls behavior in traffic, especially overtaking and speed limits.

Watch Out For Animals

In Finland there are lots of elks and deer. Warning signs mark the most frequent animal crossings. Animals tend to move especially at dawn and in dusk. Please remember that a crash with an animal might be disastrous.

Service Stations

Service stations are usually open from 7:00 to 21:00, and for a shorter time on Sundays. The 95 and 98 octane petrol sold in Finland is unleaded. There are service stations which stay open all night, please see list below:

3.4 GENERAL GUIDELINES OF POLICE OPERATIONS

Traffic Control

The objective of the police is to control traffic in order to maintain safety. All competitors must observe Finland's valid traffic code throughout the event. Most part of the route stretches over public roads with the competitors driving amongst civilian traffic. The police controls traffic of all the road users on roads near the rally, including the rally route, paying attention mainly to speeding and incorrect overtaking. Speed is controlled by portable radars and radars installed in cars.

Competitors' Offences

If a competitor's offence is observed by the traffic control of the police during the rally, the vehicle will be stopped and the crew briefly reported about the occurrence.

More serious offences, where a competitor may be guilty of dangerous driving of grave nature or serious disregard, can lead to an immediate temporary ban to drive and a withdrawal of driving licence. In these instances the police officer will inform the offender of the exact moment when his right to drive on expires. Serious disregard implies an offence of, for example, speed limit, overtaking ban or yielding obligations, which reflects in the offender a serious disregard towards road safety, yet is less serious than dangerous driving of gross nature. A driving ban of 1-3 weeks is normally imposed for serious disregard, well as the ban for dangerous driving of grave nature is 1-6 months.

EXCEEDING THE SPEED LIMIT BY 30 KPH CAN BE CONSIDERED SERIOUS DISREGARD.

This also applies to foreign competitors. The use or possession of radar detector in civilian traffic, even in vehicles or trailers registered in a foreign country, is forbidden.

Reporting of accidents and obligation to give assistance

Always report accidents on special stages immediately to the organiser. As for accidents outside the special stages, there are prescriptions in the Finnish Traffic Code:

All parties in an accident have to give their contact details to others involved and when asked to do so, they are obliged to give information about what happened. In case of serious injury, this must be reported to the police, no matter who is the guilty party.

The police must also be informed if there is damage to property and the owner or any other person are not present, who could be informed of the incident. Parties of an accident always have the responsibility to stop, help the injured to their best knowledge and to take part in the investigation of the accident. In addition to this, all road users are obliged to help transporting any patient to the nearest hospital, should the patient's condition so require and should the vehicle in question be applicable to such purpose. The police wishes the competitors welcome to Central Finland. We believe that the rally will be a pleasant, exciting and safe one.
